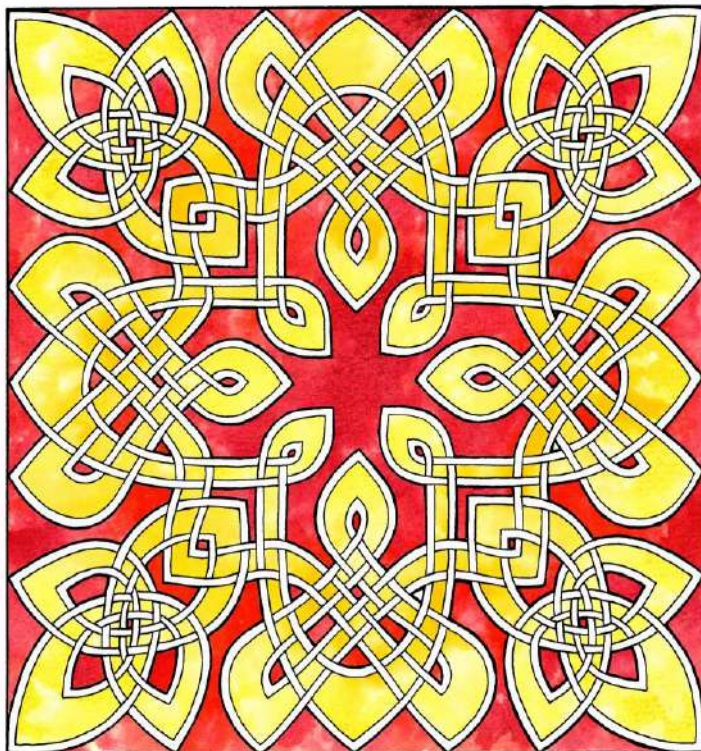

St Columba (Colum Cille) of Iona



Saint Columba is possibly the most well known of the Scottish saints; he founded the monastery on Iona which is still a place of pilgrimage today. John and I went there last month when we were in Scotland – it's a favourite place of ours. I thought I would

tell you a little about Columba and about the island he made his home.

Columba would probably have remained a little-known figure if Adomnán, the ninth Abbot of Iona, had not written a book, the *Vita Colum Cille* (*Life of Columba*), this helped to spread Columba and Iona's fame across Christendom.

From this book, we know that Columba left Ireland in 563 AD and settled with the Gaels of Dál Riata, where he was granted the Island of Iona to found his monastery. For the Gaelic warrior kings, Columba was a useful asset. His monastery provided education for their sons, he was a close advisor to the king, and he served as a diplomat to the king's neighbours in Pictland and Ireland. Columba's blessing was treasured by kings - a powerful symbol of their authority, and, in return for Columba's support, the Gaels gave the monastery land and protection.

Columba died in 597, but his monastery's influence continued to grow, leading to the foundation of new monasteries in Ireland and as far away as Lindisfarne in Northumbria. Kings wished to be buried near to Columba, and a network of Celtic high crosses and processional routes developed around his shrine.

At its height, the Monastery Iona produced *The Book of Kells*, a masterpiece of art but when shortly after, in 794 AD, the Vikings descended on Iona, many of the treasures were sent to Ireland for safe keeping. Columba's relics were finally removed in 849 AD and divided between Alba and Ireland.

The Abbey on Iona is a very special place to visit, but the island itself is also beautiful, it's what has been called a 'thin place' – somewhere where God is felt to be closer.



I think that may be the case with any place that is naturally very beautiful, but Iona's beaches are very special places to be and certainly

give a real sense of God's blessings to us.

It was when I was standing on this beach last month that one of St Augustine's sayings came to mind:

'Thou hast made us for thyself. O Lord, and our souls are restless until they find their rest in thee.'

Standing on that beach, I felt a real sense of being 'at home' in God, and we all need to feel that sense of belonging and being valued to make sense of our lives.

God calls us home to him in Christ and in God we find our true home: I pray that we may all find our true home in God this month, and a sense of being accepted and loved just as we are!

Local History Corner

Prominent Speakers in Creswell

From a report in the Derbyshire Times of February 1921, we learn that in his time as Vicar of Elmton and Creswell, the Rev.J.E.Paget invited prominent people to give talks in the Church Schools.

During World War One, one of these was George Lansbury who had strong Christian beliefs and campaigned for women's rights, social justice and world disarmament. He became an MP in 1910 (MPs were first paid in 1911 and so years before this he couldn't afford to become one). Later he led the Labour Party from 1932-1935 and eventually became the editor of the Daily Herald.

(Angela Lansbury, the actress, is his granddaughter.)

Then in February 1921 it was reported that the Rev.R.Courtier-Forster had been to speak in Creswell. He had been, for 9 years, the British Chaplain at Odessa and the Russian ports of the Black Sea. He was a fluent Russian speaker so learned at first hand the situation in the country. For seven years he had lived under the Czarist regime, then the Provisional Government and finally for seven months under the Soviets. He recalled seeing women and children murdered, the pillaging of shops and the indiscriminate street firing of Lenin's army.

Some time later he was denounced in Russia as a propagandist and thrown into prison. Finally he was branded a master spy and deported to Lithuania. From here he escaped to Austria with secret papers ordering the Lithuanian Revolution sewn into the lining of his coat. These he eventually delivered to the authorities in England.

This talk was held almost a hundred years ago. His exploits and adventures must have sounded very exciting and almost unbelievable to his audience in Creswell!

Creswell between the Wars

Can you remember:-

Pit Pony races held annually, on what was called Low's Field, the last field on the left before turning up to Elmton. There were some lovely horses, I particularly remember a white horse called Twig and a black one called Tiny. There were bookmakers taking bets and the ponies were ridden by their drivers in the pit. There were no saddles, the horses were ridden bareback.

In the same field there was a an aeroplane once a year on a summer evening taking people for rides at 5/- a time.

The Whitwell v Creswell cricket matches on Whit Monday and August Bank Holiday used to draw large crowds.

The Houghton Cup Matches contested by all the Bolsover Colliery Company Teams over two days, were a huge event. The cricket ground was sacred during this tournament, Billy Kirk, the head grounds man, did not allow spectators to step on the grass.

(As well as the cricket teams there were hockey teams, tennis teams, bowling teams and football teams.)

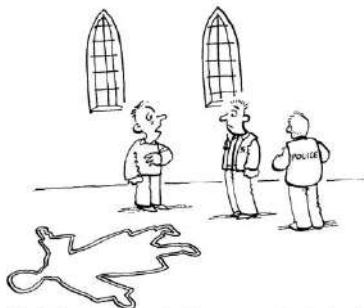

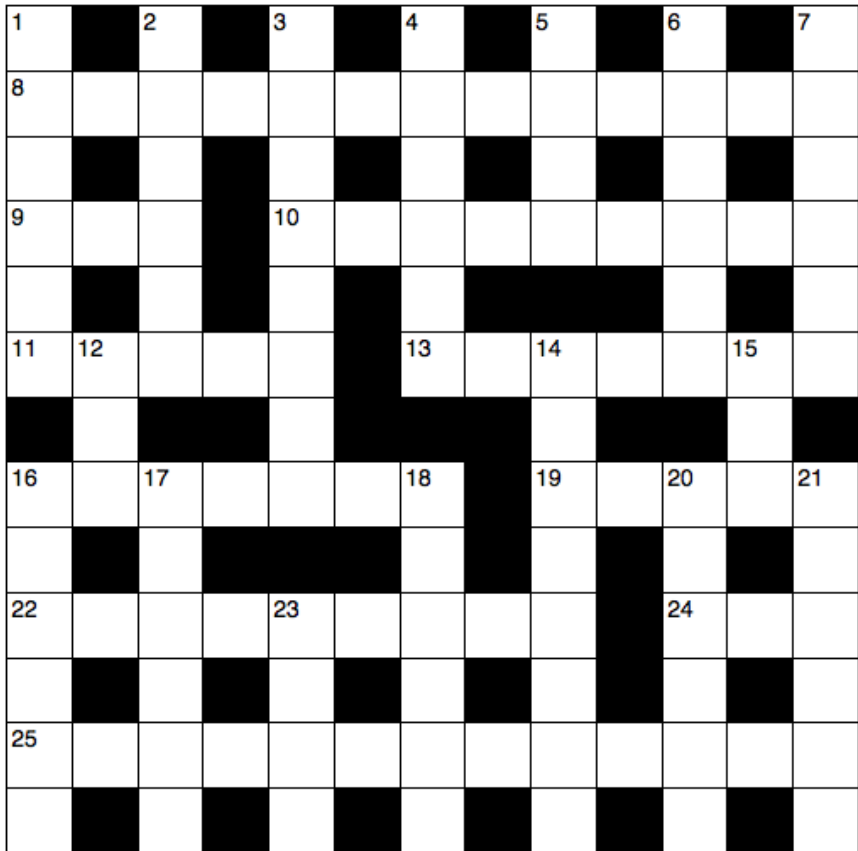

Recipe for the Month



Super Spring Salad

Preparation time less than 30 minutes

Cooking time 10 minutes



Ingredients

- 12 Jersey Royal potatoes
- 10 green asparagus spears, sliced on an angle
- 150g/5½oz young broad beans, podded
- 150g/5½oz peas, podded
- 150g/5½oz fresh or frozen soy beans
- 3 spring onions, sliced on an angle
- drizzle of olive oil
- 4 purple asparagus spears, sliced using a peeler
- 1 lemon, juice only
- 2 shallots, cut into rings
- 15 mint leaves, 10 torn, 5 shredded
- small bunch of chervil
- handful watercress
- punnet of pea shoots
- sea salt and freshly ground black pepper

For the dressing

- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 5 tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 tsp walnut oil
- 300ml/10½oz extra virgin olive oil

Method

1. Bring a large pot of water to the boil and blanch the potatoes, drain and carefully slice in half.
2. Bring a large pot of salted water to the boil. Drop in the green asparagus, broad beans, peas, soy beans and spring onions

and cook for a couple of minutes. Drain and run under cold water to stop them cooking but not to cool them.

3. Spread on a tray with the potatoes. Sprinkle with a little olive oil and season with salt and pepper.
4. Put the purple asparagus in a bowl and sprinkle with lemon juice and salt to cure and soften.
5. For the dressing, whisk together the mustard and vinegar in a bowl, slowly adding the oils. It should have a thick consistency, like a sauce. Season with a good amount of salt and black pepper.
6. Mix all of the vegetables with the shallots, mint, chervil, watercress and pea shoots and pour over the dressing.
7. Divide between four plates and dig in.

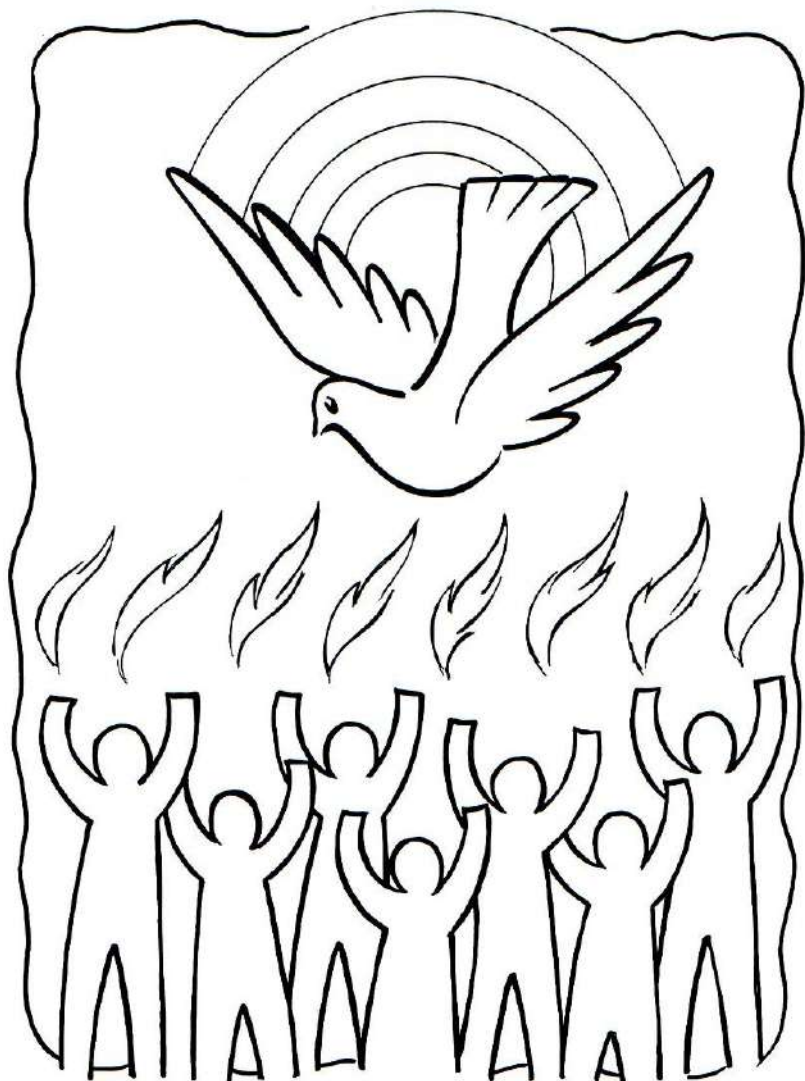
