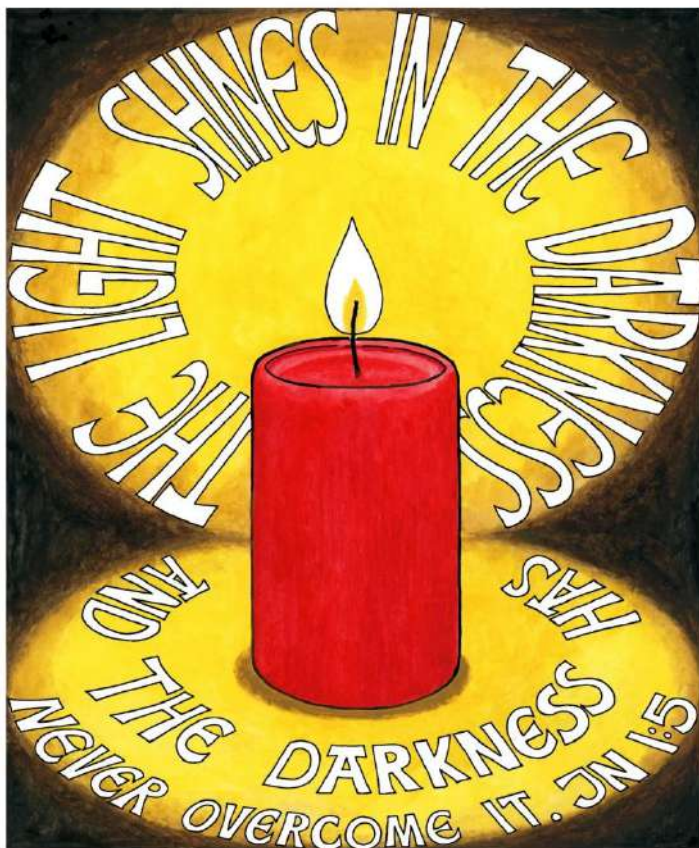

Waiting for the Light

'Holidays are coming!' well according to the latest Coca Cola advert they are!

If you watch any television at all, you will be aware that the latest round of Christmas adverts have begun. They will depict Christmas in a variety of ways but most of them will show happy families of all generations gathered together and celebrating; tables will be groaning with food and presents will be stacked under trees; children will be shown in ecstasies over the latest toys ... the favourite toy this year being a unicorn which produces slimy poo!? (Or so the paper said this morning?)

I do enjoy these adverts because I have to admit that some are affecting and funny and they do conjure up times of fun and memories of childhood family Christmases, with the whole family at my gran's house all playing silly games such as 'ring on a string' (ask if you need to!) Of course we all know that Christmases like that don't really happen ... there is always at least one disagreement or upset because we are all human and fallible, and somehow when we get together with the intention of having a 'good time', it never quite matches up to what we expect. For many people it will not be any sort of 'good time' this Christmas. For Christians in the Middle East and other countries where they are persecuted, Christmas will bring with it a heightened sense of fear. For others, Christmas day will be no different to any other day which leaves them without family or shelter or food: and for many there will be crushing loneliness made even worse by the

perceived fun which the rest of the world is enjoying.

But it is exactly to those suffering people that the Incarnation of Christ is aimed and actually the world in Jesus times was just as dark with violence and injustice as our world is today; people then and today were asking the same question *'where is the light?'*

God's promise, through the prophet Isaiah, is this *"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned" Is. 9:2*

God's light *has* come in Jesus and it is up to us who are Christians to live out the life in our lives so that others will see that light.

The days and the news may seem dark at the moment but when it is *very* dark ... light shines even more brightly: by *our* actions and the way in which we live, we can help the light of Christ shine through *us*.



May the light of Christ shine in your hearts and lives and overflow into the world this Christmas time.

LOCAL HISTORY CORNER



A Suffragette in Creswell

More than 1,000 women were arrested and many imprisoned during the battle to win the vote for women. Support for these women and also for objectors to WWI came in Creswell from Pacifist members of the Primitive Methodist Chapel on Elmton Road.(This building was demolished and the County Library now stands there.)

In January 1917 there was a meeting in Creswell of people who were against the war. Wounded soldiers from the V.A.D Hospital (in the Drill Hall) also attended and stopped the meeting singing patriotic songs and waving Union Jacks. Many Creswell people though were indignant at the action of the Pacifists.

The next year on September 18th 1918, Sylvia Pankhurst the noted Suffragette, was invited to speak at the Primitive Methodist Chapel, not about votes for women but about the ongoing war. In her speech she said WWI was not a war of freedom or liberation but of capitalist nations struggling to get control of the raw materials of the world. The Allied Governments were not troubling themselves with people but just wanted to obtain mineral deposits and the oil from the German Colonies in Mesopotamia.

Following this speech she was arrested and summoned to appear at Renishaw Court in Eckington charged with attempting to cause mutiny, sedition and disaffection among H.M. Forces and the civilian population.

A month later in October 1918 Sylvia Pankhurst arrived at the court in Renishaw supported by a group of pacifists from Creswell. Present was a local newspaper reporter whom she questioned. Several Creswell men spoke in her defence:

Alfred Neild said that he'd heard her speech but left because he was fed up!

George Holdsworth admitted he was aware that Lloyd George and Churchill had both said that at the close of war we should be masters of the world's raw materials.

Samuel Smith, a conscientious objector, also said there was nothing seditious in her speech and no objections were raised at the meeting.

William Godley, chairman of the meeting said there was nothing to incite soldiers to mutiny.

Daniel Harding, Reuben Shelton and others offered similar testimonies. John Spencer, General Secretary of the Derbyshire Miners Association said it was a large, orderly and very intelligent meeting. Mr. Moore, the Public Prosecutor, agreed with him.

After deliberation the Bench was satisfied there was a case to answer and Sylvia Pankhurst was fined £50 plus £8.6s costs. She replied that she was not in a position to pay the fine and was given permission to appeal.

Sylvia Pankhurst wasn't deterred and a few weeks later came back to Creswell and addressed an open air meeting where amongst the crowd were discharged soldiers and men in khaki and hospital blue. The Chairman was again John Spencer who said they had been denied the use of the schools. There were heated arguments between the crowd and the chairman about Sylvia Pankhurst's case and freedom of speech. A potato was thrown and a cynic suggested that eggs were too expensive for a demonstration like this!

When Sylvia Pankhurst arrived she was greeted with cheers and boos. She said she had to pay the fine or go to prison for three months when she would go on hunger strike. A collection was then taken to pay her fine but by this time many of the hecklers had gone. The meeting concluded with the singing of The Red Flag.

A month later war ended when the Armistice was signed.

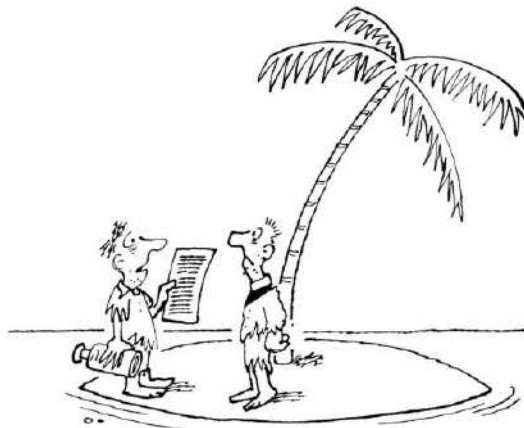

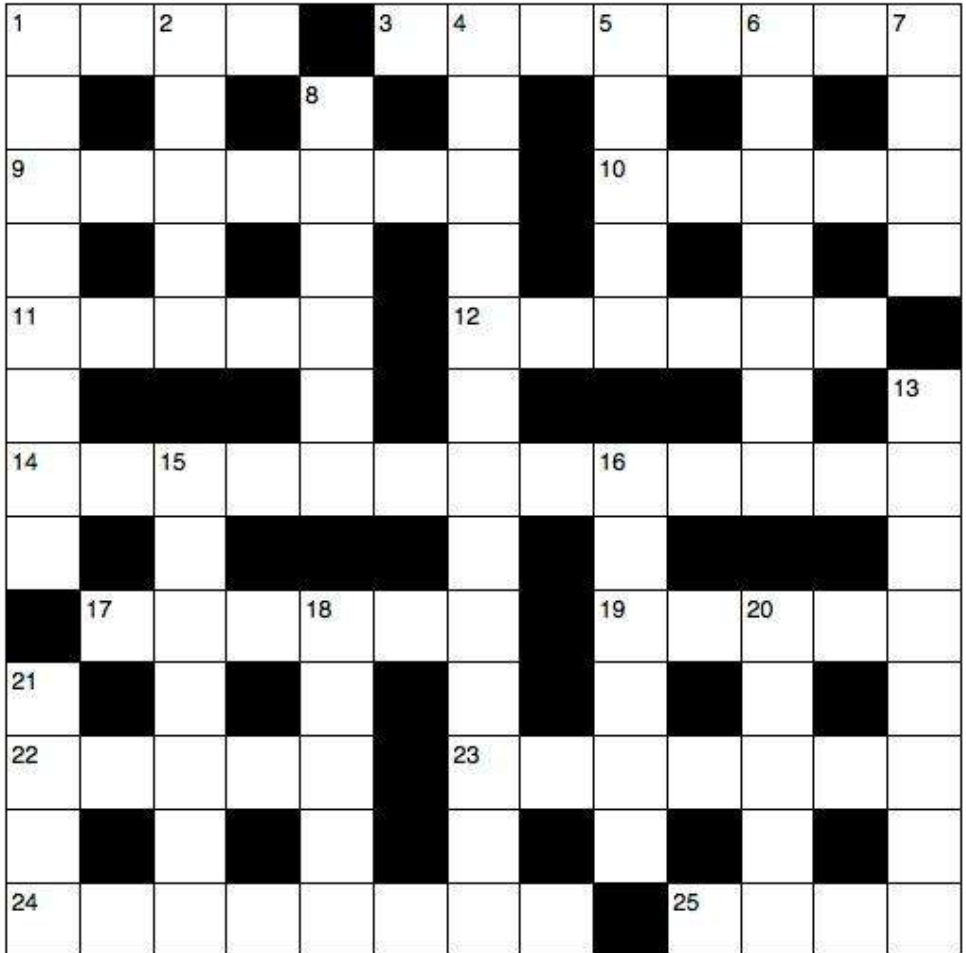

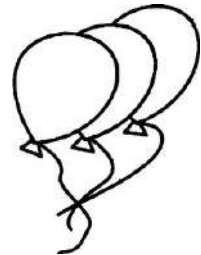
